BIS Certification for Blending Unit for Manufacturing of Fortified Rice

BIS Certification for Fatty Acids

As per the Quality Control Order, 2022, of the Department of Chemicals and Petrochemicals, the Bureau of Indian Standards has made it mandatory to obtain BIS certification for all types of Fatty Acids. BIS certification is compulsory for 1, 3 Phenylenediamine, Lauric Acid, Acid Oil, Palm Fatty Acids, Rice Bran Fatty Acids, Coconut Fatty Acids, Rubber Seed Fatty Acids, Hydrogenated Rice Bran Fatty Acids.

Bicycles- Retro Reflective Devices

As per the Bureau of Indian Standards (Quality Control) Amendment Order, 2021, BIS certification for Bicycles-Retro Reflective Devices is mandatory covered under IS/ISO 6742-2:2015 and clause 4.14 of IS 10613:2014. Only those devices bearing ISI Mark under licence and Certificate of Conformity could be produced, traded/sold, stocked and imported in India.



From the Desk

Why does the Government of India through its ministries bring out the Quality Control Orders (QCOs) for compulsory certification? This question has been asked by industry people, traders, importers, etc from time to time. The following is considered before bringing out a Quality Control Order for any product:

- In public interest.
- Protection of human, animal and plant health.
- Safety of the environment.
- Prevention of unfair trade practices
- National security

Considering the above factors and also taking cognizance of dumping of sub-standard material by manufacturers/exporters of the other countries to India, the ministries publish QCO directing compulsory certification of products by Bureau of Indian Standards.

These QCOs help the Indian industries to capture 25% of the market according to an informal study. Most-of the manufacturers of substandard products sending their goods & products, either close their business in India or take more time than domestic manufacturers; to be at par with quality parameters set out in Indian Standards. The more time taken BIS; helps Indian Industry to capture the market.
